### **Directed by Marc Ruffino**

Set in 1963 Brighton, England, where the mood is very hip, the play tells the story of Francis Henshall, a hapless man recently fired from a skiffle band, who finds himself employed by two bosses at the same time. One boss is a small-time gangster, Rosco Crabbe, who is in town to collect a fee from his fiancée's gangster father. But Roscoe is really his twin sister, Rachel, in disguise. That's because Roscoe has been murdered by Stanley, with whom Rachel is in love! When Stanley becomes Francis' other "quvnor," Francis must twist himself into knots to serve both bosses without them discovering each other. Added to this are Francis' insatiable appetites for food and the love of a beautiful woman, which get in his way. It's a madcap farce filled with hilarity, physical comedy, a little audience participation, slightly bawdy humor, and a live skiffle band on stage.

Marc Ruffino has been involved in theater for over 25 years. He has been an English teacher since 1995 and a high school drama director since 2000. Marc has performed in numerous plays for Aurora Players, earning three acting awards for his roles in *Grease*, *Present Laughter*, and *Amateurs*. He has appeared on stage with Lancaster Opera House, Desiderio's Dinner Theatre, Rocking Horse Productions, and Shakespeare In Delaware Park.

The play opens on the eve of the 25th birthday of Catherine, an extremely intelligent but troubled young woman. She is struggling to come to terms with the recent death of her father, Robert, a brilliant but mentally unstable mathematician whom she cared for until his death. While grappling with grief and her own identity and aspirations as a mathematician, she must now deal with her estranged sister, Claire, who has come back for the funeral with a view towards "saving" Catherine. There's also Hal, a former student of Robert's, who arrives to review the 103 notebooks he left. When a groundbreaking mathematical proof is discovered among her father's papers, Catherine must confront the legacy of genius and madness that runs in her family. The play won the 2001 Pulitzer Prize for drama and a Tony Award® for Best Play. It was also adapted into a feature film in 2005 starring Gwyneth Paltrow and Anthony Hopkins.

Patricia Hoefler has been very active with Aurora Players. Her direction of Amateurs in 2021 was recognized with a TANYS award for Excellence in Directing. Prior to that, she directed She Loves Me and Neil Simon's comedy, Barefoot in the Park. She also directed a number of shows in Rhode Island, where she pursued her MFA theater degree in Performance and Society, with a focus on directing and playwriting.

Sidney Bruhl, a washed-up playwright, receives a manuscript written by a former student, Clifford Anderson, which would be a perfect play to revive Sidney's reputation on Broadway. The plan to get possession of that script, change its author's name, and present it as his own is only the beginning. To say any more would give away the maniacal and sinister twists and turns that accompany this rollercoaster of a black comedy. Critics have praised Deathtrap as one of the greatest thrillers ever written, with Cue Magazine calling it "Two-thirds a thriller and one-third a devilishly clever comedy."

Christine Estabrook has starred in hit Broadway shows, won accolades and acting awards for Off-Broadway performances and earned a Master of Fine Arts degree from Yale Drama School. While in New York City, she starred in numerous plays, winning a coveted Obie Award for her work in Pastorale and a Drama Desk Award for The Boy's Next Door. From 2007-2009, she performed in the Tony Award-winning musical Spring Awakening. Ms. Estabrook has had memorable roles in both film and television, among them: Mad Men, American Horror Story, Penny Dreadful, City of Angels, Designated Survivor, and Desperate Housewives.
